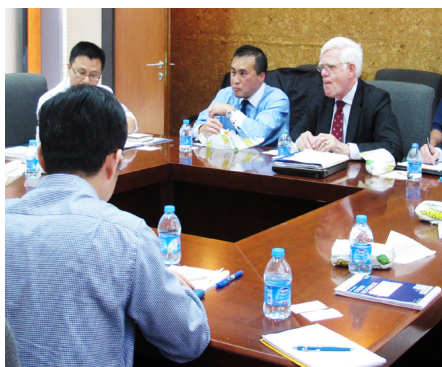

Founded in October 2013, the Institute of International and Strategic Studies (IISS) at Peking University is a research entity and think tank focusing on major issues related to world politics, international security, global governance, and foreign relations of the major countries. It aims to present strategic insights and policy recommendations for government agencies, enterprises, and various institutions in China and abroad. IISS hosts public presentations, roundtables, seminars, and conferences that provide opportunities for specialists, officials, scholars, and students to exchange ideas and discuss policy issues.

IISS sets China's foreign relations and international strategy as a top priority in research work. In this and other research areas, IISS emphasizes practical, in-depth knowledge and objective analyses based on the researchers' field work. Interdisciplinary programs related to ecological environment, energy development, public health, natural calamity, cyber-security, and other non-traditional security issues are also encouraged.

IISS publishes a variety of written works, including the occasional papers entitled International and Strategic Studies Report, monographs, and the yearly China International Strategy Review. It also presents reports commissioned by government institutions. It undertakes training programs and receives visiting scholars in the field of international and strategic studies.

The predecessor of IISS was the Center for International and Strategic Studies at Peking University, which was established in 2007 and publicized a number of high-quality works. Administered by Peking University, IISS is affiliated with the University's School of International Studies in terms of teaching and management. The Institute of International and Strategic Studies launches its own research projects, has its own budget and office space, and collaborates with other institutions inside and outside Peking University.
